



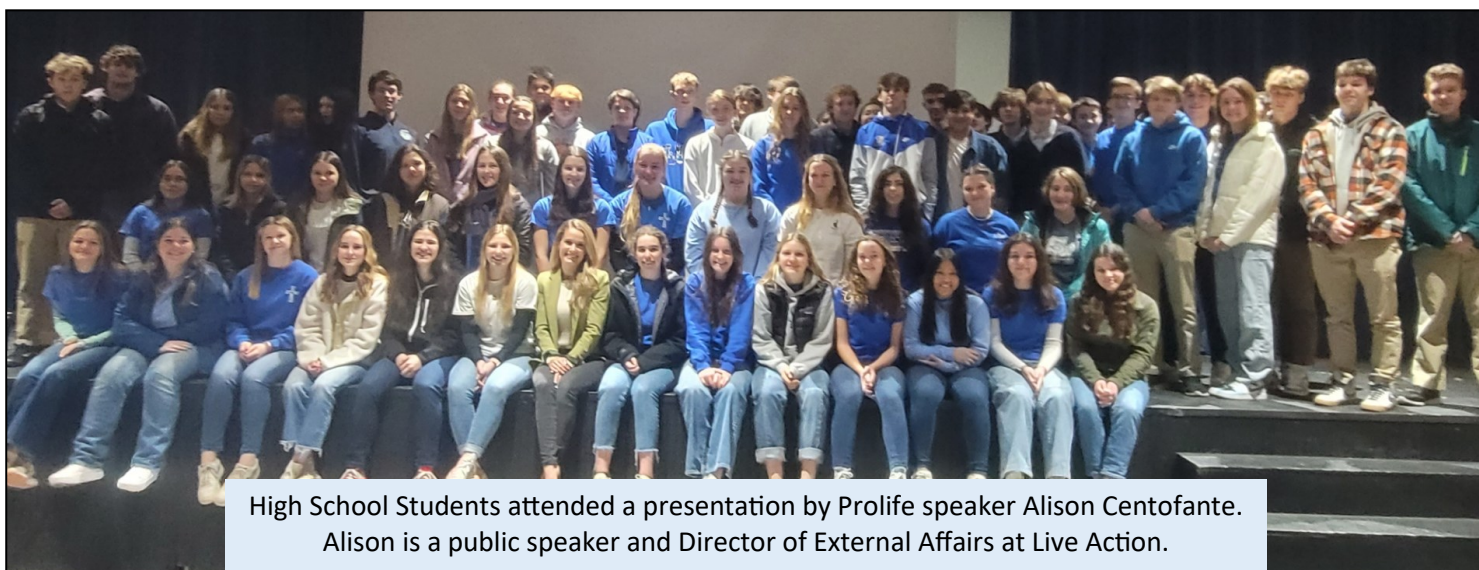
Catholic School Corner



The 2023 St. Mary School National Honor Society Induction Ceremony took place Tuesday, February 28th. Fr. Ben Martin opened the ceremony with an invocation and blessing. NHS Chapter President Amelia Dunham (senior) introduced Rachel Amalfitano, a 2012 St. Mary alumna, who gave the keynote address.
