4-H Exploration Days 2023

Leelanau County youth are invited to join over 1,000 young people for three days of fun, adventure and learning at **4-H Exploration Days 2023**. "All Paths Lead to 4-H" is the theme for this annual 4-H event, held Wednesday, June 21 through Friday, June 23 on the campus of Michigan State University.

We hope that you will join us this year – <u>just register as a 4-H youth and be part of our delegation!</u> Don't miss the excitement on MSU's campus! From magic to kayaking, or inline skating to future leader dogs, participants may take part in sessions that are suited to the interests of everyone-choose from over 100 different action-packed options! When not involved with their learning sessions, students may experience recreation and MSU tour choices such as the MSU Breslin Center, the Dairy Store, National Superconducting Cyclotron Laboratory, and the 4-H Children's Garden.

Participants must be at least 12 years old by January 1, 2023. The event is sponsored by the Michigan 4-H Program, but participants do <u>not</u> need to be a current 4-H member to attend. So, invite a friend to join you! You can stay in the same dorm room together. Parents and 4-H volunteers are invited, too! If you are interested in volunteering as an adult chaperone, feel free to contact the MSU Extension office for more details. Volunteer fees (\$120) will be fully covered by our county.

The fee to attend as a youth is \$220 and includes 2 nights lodging, 7 meals, an event T-shirt, and the learning option(s) of your choice (a few options have age restrictions). It also includes optional recreational activities like skating, biking, basketball, volleyball, a dance, and other fun evening activities. Transportation to and from campus is provided via school buses for a small fee.

Early registration starting Thursday, March 21, at 7 pm is strongly encouraged as many sessions fill quickly, and there are only 1000 spots for youth this year.

4-H TRACTOR SAFETY PROGRAM

For 14 and 15 Year Old Youth

Teens can improve their chances of employment this summer by completing a tractor safety training course!

Successful completion of a tractor operation safety course is required for all youth under the age of 16 who perform farm jobs classified as hazardous, under the U.S. Department of Labor's Hazardous Occupation Order.

To become certified, participants must attend all three course meetings, & pass an in-person written test and tractor driving test.

Who: Leelanau 4-H will host this training for 14 & 15 Year Old Youth. Youth must be age 14 by June 1st, 2023. Space is limited! (16-19 year olds are encouraged to participate, but priority is given to 14-15 year olds). Class curriculum follows Gearing Up for Safety: Production Agriculture Safety Training for Youth

Where: NW MI Horticulture Research Center, 6686 S. Center Hwy., Traverse City. (County Road 633 between Suttons Bay & Traverse City)

When: Sundays, April 30th, May 7th & May 21st, from 3-5 p.m. An in-person written and driving test will be given on Sunday, June 4th* by appointment between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. (using SignUp Genius)

(*Rain date will be Sunday, June 11th.)

Cost: \$60 per person - includes: classes, manual, certificate, and snack on test day. Some scholarships are available if finances are an issue.

The registration deadline is Friday, April 21st, 2023.
